Please pay close attention to the information provided in the announcement, including if snow routes are in effect.

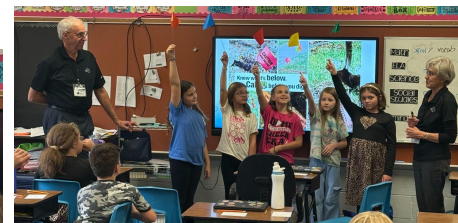
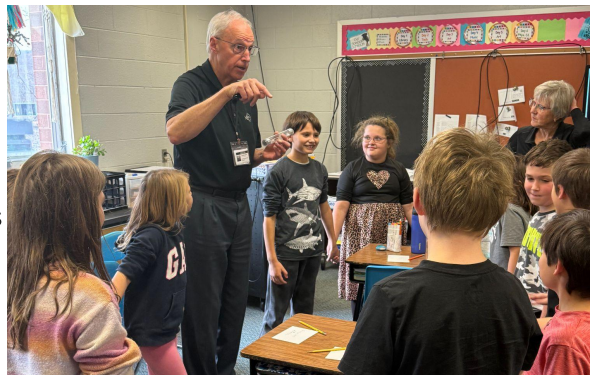
If snow routes become in effect in the event of a delay, they will not be in effect for the afternoon dismissal routes unless it is announced as such.

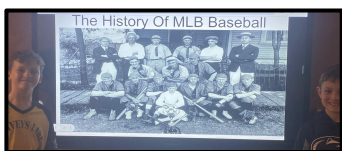
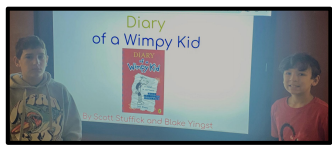


Second Grade Visits the Back Mountain Memorial Library
