- Parking Lot redesign and repaving

- Install elevator to make school ADA compliant
- Roof Replacement and possible addition of solar
- Boiler replacement and possible conversion to gas
- Underground oil tank replacement/removal
- Continue to replace classrooms floors and paint-PreK and K
- Continue to replace A/C units
- Gym renovation-floors, windows, painting, lunch tables installed, A/C
- Build new regulation size gymnasium
- Perimeter fencing replaced
- Whitney Avenue hillside cleaned and landscaped
- Library water issue corrected and library floor replaced
- Any other projects identified in Facilities study

Budgetary Matters


- Balanced Budget –ended 2023-2024 year in a sound financial position
- Compilation Completed-auditor noted SR was “a very fiscally sound school”
- New teachers hired at or above the diocesan scale- \$42K minimum
- Teacher bonuses given at Christmas 2023 (\$1K-\$2K)
- Teacher salaries increased by 5% plus the bonuses were built in.

Goals


- **Catholic Identity**- To provide meaningful faith formation experiences for our faculty, students and parents using the Divine Renovation parish renewal program.

- **Academic Achievement**-To utilize the PLC's/PD's to improve instructional strategies in order to raise NWEA MAP scores by 10%.




Elementary

St. Rita Expense Actuals June 30, 2024




St. Rita Revenue Actuals June 30, 2024




- Average Teacher Salary – from the 24/25 Adjusted Budget
