Job Summary:

The Elementary Teacher is responsible for planning, organizing, and implementing an appropriate instructional program that supports the academic, social, and emotional development of students in grades typically ranging from kindergarten to fifth or sixth grade. The Elementary Teacher plays a key role in fostering a love for learning, promoting student achievement, and preparing students for future academic success.

Key Responsibilities:
