



CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

P The Lord is with us this evening and always! Tonight we remember our Lord who was born in strife to bring us life. We remember His birth, life, death and resurrection for the sins and the salvation of the world. In Him we place all our hope and trust, for He removes our fears. We are sinners in need of a Savior. THE MANGER AND THE CROSS READING, pt.1

- P To a small, quiet village in the backwaters of the Roman Empire; to a small band of shepherds, tending their flocks, as they had for years, and as others had done before them for centuries; to a time far removed from us and in a place we can only think of in romantic, unreal ways came an event that changed not only that time and place, but all time and every place.
- **C** "An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them."
- P To calm those who are frightened by the idea of God's drawing close to touch our human lives and to prepare us to welcome so wondrous a gift as Emmanuel, Godwith-us,
- The angel said to them, "Be not afraid, for behold, I bring you good news of a great joy which will come to all people."
- P To infuse our hearts with joy and to open us to receive the grace that God showers into our lives,
- The angel said to them, "To you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord."
- P To give direction to those who have lost their way and wandered far from God,
- The angel said to them, "This will be a sign for you: you will find a Babe wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger."
- P To herald the Good News that God has entered human history and to celebrate the beginning of God's actions to bring all people into fellowship with Him and with one another,
- Suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among men with whom He is pleased."

THE MANGER AND THE CROSS READING, pt.2

- P As we ponder His love and the events of His birth, we also realize that looming in the background of the manger is the shape of a cross. This child is destined to cause the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be spoken against.
- The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned.
- P He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows, and familiar with suffering.
- For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on His shoulders.
- P Surely, He took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows,
- And He will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.
- P Yet we considered Him stricken by God, smitten by Him, and afflicted.
- In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us.
- P But He was pierced for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon Him, and by His wounds we are healed.
- In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. And everyone went to his own town to register.
- We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way;
- So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child.
- P The Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.
- While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son.
- P He poured out His life unto death and was numbered with the transgressors.
- She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.

- P Taking Jesus' body, the two of them wrapped it, with the spices, in strips of linen.
- Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews?"
- P Above His head they placed the written charge against Him: This is Jesus, the King of the Jews.
- Herod...gave orders to kill all the boys in Bethlehem and its vicinity who were two years old and under.
- P At that moment, the earth shook and rocks split. The tombs broke open and the bodies of many holy people who had died were raised to life.
- The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.
- They gave the soldiers a large sum of money, telling them, "You are to say, 'His disciples came during the night and stole Him away while we were asleep."
- And Jesus grew in wisdom and in stature, and in favor with God and men.


