THROUGH GOD'S EYES

John tells us the story in chapter 13 of his Gospel. It was just one day before Jesus would be nailed to a cross. One day before he would be stripped and whipped and mocked and spat upon.

As John describes Jesus on the brink of the worst day of his life, the apostle writes one of the most astonishing lines in the Bible. He tells us that with our Lord fully aware of the mental anguish and then physical pain that faced Him only hours away, Jesus knew “that the Father had put all things under His power.” What an amazing perspective for a man about to be tortured and murdered!

If somebody was about to nail me to a cross, I might be screaming in fear and praying for help, but I seriously doubt that I would be overwhelmed with a consciousness of how much God was blessing and empowering me at that moment. Jesus was obviously able to see something in His circumstances that would have eluded me. Scripture reminds us, “Man does not see as God sees.”

We do know that resurrection power changed a benediction into a glorious invocation. Easter is a calendar date marking the wonderful moment when the miracle of life over death walked from the pages of antiquity onto the pavements of our life. Jesus viewed the cross through the eyes of the Father. Beyond its terror and torment He saw God’s love and strength.


Maybe I’m missing something. Maybe I need to take a closer look at my own struggles and challenges. Perhaps I need to ask, “God, in my times of fear and weakness and pain, help me to see tokens of Your goodness and grace.”

The resurrection is a veritable banquet prepared and set before every seeking heart that is thirsting and hungering for righteousness. The great Easter truth is not that we are to live anew after death – but that we are to be new here and now by the power of the resurrection. That was the most stupendous victory that has ever been won. May we all see more clearly, through God’s eyes, how the strain and sacrifice of earthly life become worthwhile because eternal values are added.





Feb. 4:

"*The Last Lifeboat*" by Hazel Gaynor is based on a true event that took place during WWII. Because of the constant bombings in Britain, some parents attempted to send their children to what they thought would be a safer location in America. That is until one ship was struck by a German U-Boat's torpedo. You will find yourself fighting for survival along with survivors on "The Last Lifeboat".

March 4:

"*The Girl Who Wrote in Silk*" by Kelli Esters is a dual timeline historical fiction that travels in time between the shameful purging of Chinese immigrants in Seattle during the 1880's and now. This is a fascinating story about two young girls who will never meet and yet are caught up in a world of secrets and deceit by the writing on a silk sleeve.

April 1:

(don't let the early date "fool" you) "*The First Ladies*" by Marie Benedict explores the unlikely friendship between Eleanor Roosevelt and civil rights activist Mary McLeod Bethune. This is a 2023 novel so we encourage you to find a copy NOW and don't let the early April date catch you off guard without a book.

Robert Trent Jones, Sr. was a famous golf course designer.

CORNER

He once re-designed the 4th hole at Baltusrol shortly before the 1954 United States Open golf tournament, one of the most prestigious prizes in the game.

His re-design of this par three hole was particularly challenging, testing the skills of even the finest golfer. He was openly criticized for making the hole too hard. In response to the criticism, Jones, Sr. teed up a ball on the 4th hole at Baltusrol to play it for his first time. He made a hole-in-one! Jones turned to the gallery and said, "Gentlemen, the defense rests. I think this hole is eminently fair."

When we talk about financial stewardship, we might fall into the trap of thinking that God's way is too hard. "First fruits" is just an expression, giving off the top is not practical, and the tithe is just impossible. It is all too hard! But Jesus reminds us, "Give and it will be given to you, pressed down, shaken together and running over."

God has re-designed how we as Christians manage our earthly resources. It is eminently fair, for everything belongs to Him. God's way is not the hard way; it is the one way to maintain a proper perspective of God as our Provider, and we as His stewards.

Places of the Passion

Ash Wednesday is February 18. We will begin the season of Lent with a 4:00pm Worship Service with Holy Communion. This Lent, we will gather to reflect on the **Places of the Passion**. We will read through the entire passion account as told by Luke, a small portion each week, and you won't be surprised at the story.

It's a simple story and you've been to these places before. The upper room, the garden of Gethsemane, the halls of Pontius Pilate and the hills of Golgotha are some of the places we remember when we meditate on our Lord's passion. Yet when Jesus enters a place, he never leaves it as he finds it. The most troubling places in our lives become the most amazing places of God's grace when Jesus visits them. We will see each week that no matter where we are in our lives, God is still coming and claiming us as His children.



The Lutheran Women's Missionary League is the official women's auxiliary of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS). All women of Trinity Lutheran Church are members and are encouraged to serve others through mission, education, inspiration, and service. We invite you to attend our meetings and learn what we are all about as we "Serve the Lord with Gladness" Psalm 100:2 our motto.

2025 was a year that no one expected! We experienced an increase of need in our community and we finished the year serving 1,123 neighbors in October, 1,388 in November, and in a 2 week period in December we served 1,168. Each month we see new neighbors in the need of food and other products.

There was personnel turnover during the year and a longtime volunteer is leaving in a few weeks. His absence will require a realignment of the Board; however, he will remain for a few weeks longer as he prepares his move. The A/C finally gave out after multiple attempts to repair it. It cost \$6,000.00 to replace the A/C and then the large refrigerator quit.

The Lord was looking down and realized the Community of Gratitude needed a lifting hand. The surrounding community came forth with the Lions Club donating 2 large refrigeration units and a volunteer family member donating an upright freezer. This is not even to mention the contributions from Trinity. Trinity Lutheran Church is a huge blessing to our organization. We continue to thank you for the weekly food donations that your members deliver to our door. In addition to the food donations we received a \$840.00 donation from Trinity Lutheran's LWML, \$1,200.00 in Walmart holiday gift cards, and \$10,000.00 Christmas gift from an anonymous Trinity member. These monies were a Godsend in the time of equipment needs and other obligations.

We thank Trinity Lutheran Church's volunteer members, church leadership, and God stepping in with these gifts in our time of need.

*Singing is beneficial to your health and well-being.
Singing offers numerous health
benefits, acting as an aerobic exercise that boosts mood,
reduces stress by lowering cortisol,
strengthens the immune system, improves lung capacity,
and enhances cognitive functions like memory and alertness,
all while releasing feel-good endorphins and
oxytocin, promoting relaxation and social bonding,
and even helping with pain
management.*

Singing:

- lowers cortisol (stress hormone) levels and activates the vagus nerve, promoting relaxation and well-being.
- releases endorphins, dopamine, and oxytocin, leading to feelings of happiness, pleasure, and connection.
- engages multiple brain areas, improving memory, concentration, and mental alertness, useful for dementia care.
- boosts confidence and provides a sense of accomplishment.
- Is an aerobic activity that improves circulation and lung capacity through deep breathing.
- can boost immune function and help fight disease, even more effectively in groups than listening alone.
- encourages better balance and strengthens core muscles.
- can alleviate chronic pain symptoms and potentially reduce the need for medication.
- releases oxytocin, creating feelings of belonging and reducing loneliness.
- enhances leadership, listening, and teamwork skills.

But most importantly, singing in your church choir raises your voice to praise our Lord, sends messages of spiritual encouragement to our congregation and dedicates your time and talents to serving. Won't you consider using the Gift that He chose for you?

The Bible gives us reason to sing:

- Praise & Thanksgiving: For God's great salvation, steadfast love, and wondrous works (1 Chronicles 16:9, 2 Samuel 22:15).
- Joy: To express gladness and rejoice in the Lord (Psalm 92:4).
- Worship: To come before God with music and song (Psalm 100:2).
- Instruction: To teach and encourage one another (Colossians 3:16).

Trinity's Sewing Angels

In the last quarter the primary focus of The Sewing Angels was doing what we could to provide warmth to the homeless and impoverished of the Ocala Forest. Sixty-six blankets were sewn and distributed. We have about twenty more that are in the last stage of completion before they are distributed.

Special thanks to Debbie Zwolak for all the many beautiful and clever crocheted items which we distributed to G.G.s House. This included twenty crocheted balls, eight ditty bags, thirteen hats, three booties, three pairs of socks, eight headbands, three mats, six snakes and 212 Christmas Card ornaments. Approximately one dozen crocheted balls are being used for angel craft project.

We continue making and distributing soapy washcloths to the 7,000 people of the Ocala National Forest who come to a food bank. In the last quarter we provided one hundred twenty six soapy washcloths and forty-four crocheted soap socks. A soap sock is a crocheted pouch that a bar of soap slips into and is closed with a strap that can hang from a faucet. It is made with cotton yarn which serves as a washcloth can be refilled easily when the soap is used up. Dorothy Flowers returned from her summer vacation with hundreds of bars of soap donated by her son-in-law who works at a packaging plant that packages bars of soap. This will go a long way in keeping our soapy washcloth ministry going strong.

One of our other outreaches is sewing pillowcase sized drawstring bags which are used for foster care kits. Forty-two foster care kit bags were recently made and filled to provide the basics for children of the Ocala National Forest who are removed from their homes. The bags included pj's, books, a stuffed toy, a blanket, toiletries, socks, underwear, clothing and snacks. It is so sad that so many children continue to be removed from their homes due to parents who are in trouble with the law or losing their lives due to drug related issues. Julia Mack has coordinated the donations needed to fill these bags and volunteers to help fill them.

The Sewing Angels received an incredibly special gift this Christmas! This comes with a special story. I sew for people out of my home. One of the groups of people I sew for is the Band of Brothers. It is a veteran's group that tells the story of their time in the service with patches sewn on their black leather vests. A man came to me with a leather vest he wanted patches sewn on for as a Christmas present for a friend. In visiting with him I found out he was the man who custom made patches for the Band of Brothers to sell as a fund raiser for that group. The funds raised by the sales of these patches supports the charities funded by Band of Brothers. The cost of making these patches he writes off on his taxes, never taking a penny for himself. He also told me that for Christmas he was providing shirts and hat with name and branch of service for one hundred twenty men in three different Veteran's homes in Michigan. I said to him you must have done very well in life to be able to do this. He looked me in the eye and said, "It's not my money, it's God's money.!" Wow! I told him about the outreach of the Sewing Angels. He said he would like to do something for us. I told him I would love to have bags made for each of the girls in our group with our logo on it. He could not wait to begin this special project. He did not take a penny for making these bags for us! At our annual Christmas gathering, the girls were so surprised by this special gift and were touched by the story of this man's generosity and story of his outreach!!!!!! We plan to make him a very special quilt!

We are now switching gears to sewing quilts for babies and children's outreaches.

We praise God for all the blessings of the Sewing Angels outreach! If you would like to join our group, we meet on Thursdays from 9:00am – 12:00pm.
