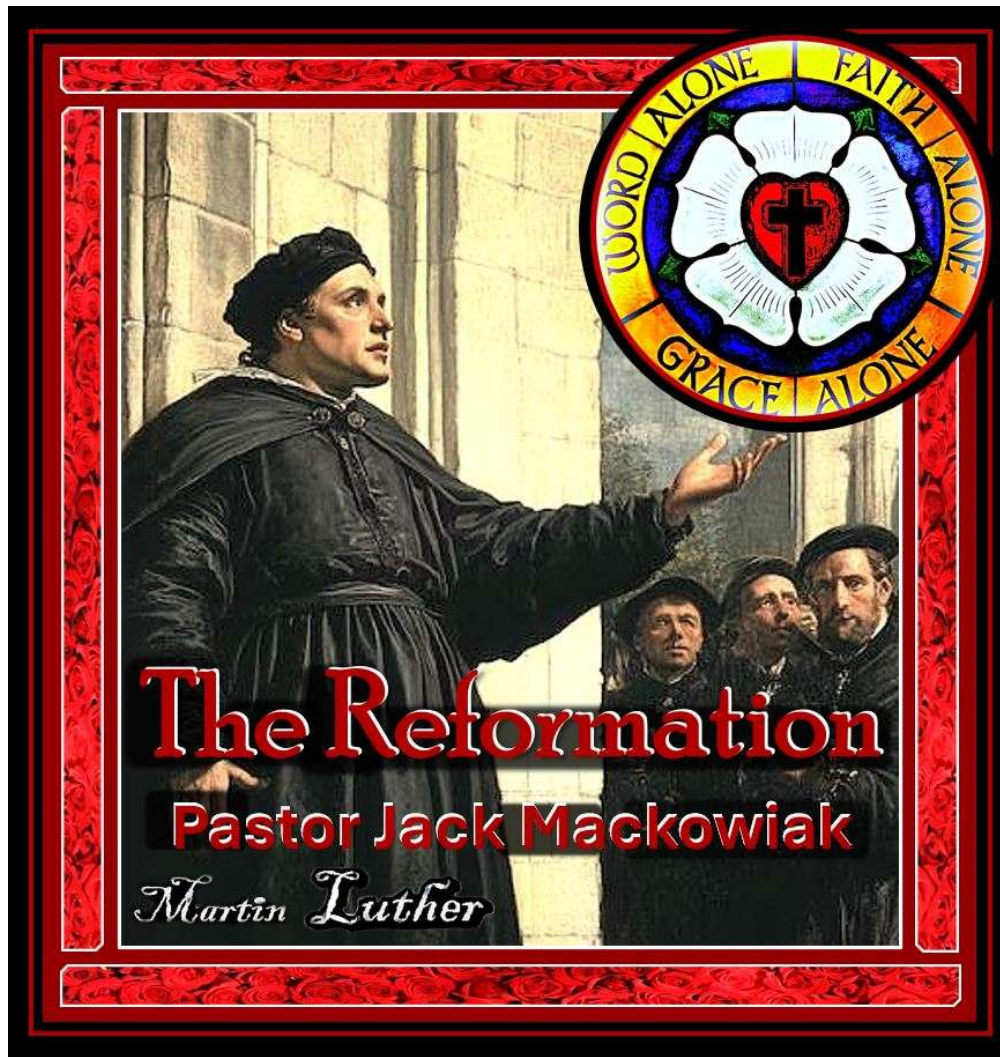

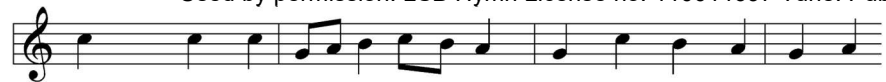

INVOCATION / CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

P It is by grace you have been saved through faith!

C It is by God's grace alone that we are able to worship Him.

P Today our worship celebrates that grace.

C The God who graciously received us into His family through Holy Baptism.

P The grace of God the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

C **The God to whom we offer our sacrifice and praise. Amen.**

P In our worship today we review the building blocks of our faith through the words of Luther's Small Catechism, beginning with the teaching on Confession. People of God, I then ask you, "What is confession?"

C **Confession has two parts: First, that we confess our sins, and second, that we receive absolution, that is, forgiveness, from the pastor as from God Himself; not doubting, but firmly believing that by it our sins are forgiven before God in heaven.**

P Humble yourselves, then and confess your sins before God, asking His forgiveness.

C **Holy and gracious God, we lay our hearts open before You. We confess our neglect of Your Word and Sacraments. We confess that we have been weak in our faith, in our devotion, and in our witness. We have sinned against You and against our fellow human beings. Forgive us, O Lord, and grant us the grace and power to walk in Your holy ways. We ask in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.**

P As you believe, so let it be. In the stead and by the command of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C **Amen.**

P Let us pray...O almighty and eternal God, now that You have assured us of the completion of our redemption through the resurrection of our Lord Jesus, give us the will to show forth in our lives what we profess with our lips; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

++THE WORD++

OLD TESTAMENT TEACHING

P Hear now the Decalog – the Ten Commandments – as recorded in Exodus 20: “And God spoke all these words: I am the Lord your God,...and you shall have no other gods before me...you shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God...remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy...honor your father and your mother...you shall not murder...you shall not commit adultery...you shall not steal...you shall not give false testimony against your neighbor...you shall not covet your neighbor’s house...or anything that belongs to your neighbor.” What does God say about all these commandments?

C **He says: “I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sins of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love me and keep my commandments.”**

P What does this mean?

C **God threatens to punish all who break His commandments. Therefore we should fear His wrath and not do anything against them. But He promises grace and every blessing to all who keep these commandments. Therefore, we should also love and trust in Him and gladly do what He commands.**

NEW TESTAMENT TEACHING

P Martin Luther suggested we daily affirm our baptism. Let us joyfully share in the Small Catechism section on Holy Baptism. First, what is baptism?

C **Baptism is not just plain water, but it is the water included in God’s command and combined with God’s Word.**

P Which is that Word of God?

C **Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Matthew: “Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.”**

P Second, what benefits does baptism give?

C **It works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare.**

- P** Which are these words and promises of God?
- C** **Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Mark: “He who believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned.”**

COMMUNION LITURGY

P The Lord be with you.

P In his Small Catechism Martin Luther asks, "What is the Lord's Supper?"

C **It is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink.**

P He further asks, "What is the benefit of such eating and drinking?"

C **That is shown us by these words, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins"; namely, that in the Sacrament forgiveness of sins, life and salvation are given us!**

P Therefore come and receive Christ's true body and blood as we rejoice in our common salvation!

C **Holy, holy, holy are You, God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of Your glory.**

P Lord, remember us in Your kingdom and teach us to pray:

C **Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven; Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass**

against us; and lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

P As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes again.

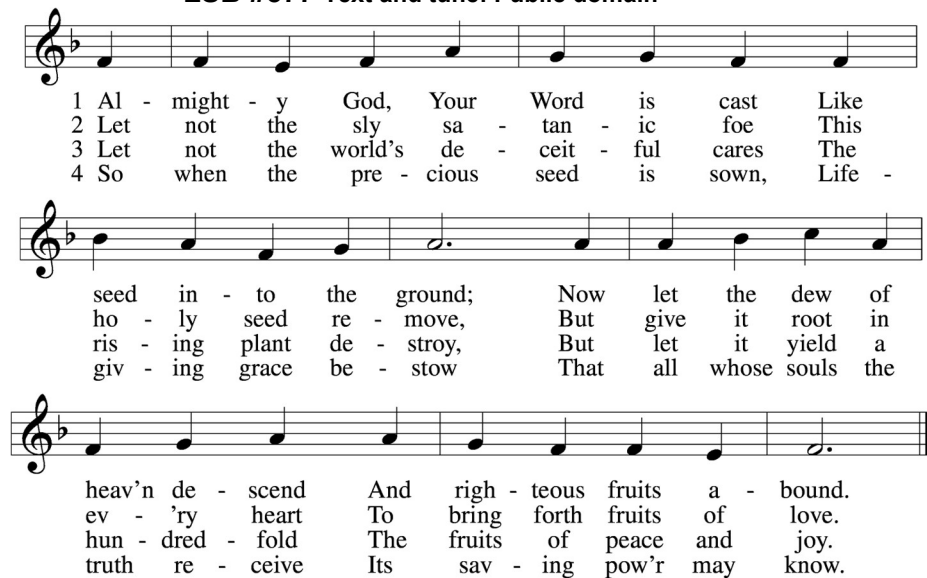
