Corn is a fascinating and versatile food with some surprising facts behind it. For one, corn is actually a grain, a fruit, and a vegetable—all at the same time! The kernels are considered seeds (which makes them a grain), they develop from the flower of the plant (making them a fruit), and when eaten fresh like sweet corn, they're treated as a vegetable. Another cool fact is that corn is one of the most widely grown crops in the world and has been cultivated for thousands of years, originally by Indigenous peoples in the Americas. Plus, each ear of corn typically has an even number of rows—usually 16—and nearly always ends up with about 800 kernels in total. Talk about neat and organized nature!
