Summarize the results of your most recent survey(s) of staff, students, and families. During the spring of 2025, Nett Lake School conducted surveys of staff, students, and families to assess academic achievement and satisfaction related to student learning. Results indicated concern regarding overall academic performance, particularly in mathematics. While reading scores showed a slight decline compared to the previous year, they remained stronger than math outcomes. Survey feedback from all groups consistently reflected that math achievement continues to be an area of significant need and historical challenge for the school.

Staff met on October 30<sup>th</sup> to discuss an increase in instructional support, additional interventions, and more targeted use of data to improve math outcomes. Students reported that they enjoy learning but sometimes struggle with understanding math concepts and maintaining confidence in the subject. Across all groups, there was a shared commitment to improving academic performance and supporting effective instructional practices to help students grow in both reading and math.
