High School Principal: Mr. Ray Kelly

As we prepare for the 2025–2026 school year, I would like to share several important updates and reminders to ensure a smooth and successful start to the year.

The dismissal process, carefully designed for the safety of our students and staff, will remain unchanged from last year. All student drivers will park in the back lot between the school and the tennis courts. Those picking up students will stage on the right-hand side of the divide and remain there until student drivers exit the student parking lot. It is important to note that students being picked up are **NOT** permitted to cross the road to access their ride, ensuring their safety.

1. Bus riders will be dismissed first.
2. Walkers and drivers will be dismissed once the buses depart the High School.
3. Walkers must exit the building using the High School Main Office doors.
4. Drivers will exit through the gymnasium doors, which lead to the student parking lot.
5. Pickups will then be dismissed.
6. Once the student parking lot is cleared, individuals can pick up students outside the gymnasium doors.
7. Students cannot be picked up on the “exit” side of the divide and should not pass cars waiting to pick up their children.

All students are required to complete 44 hours of Community Service to meet graduation requirements, with a minimum of 11 hours to be completed annually. Community service is not just a requirement but a valuable contribution to society, and we encourage students to see the impact of their efforts. Additionally, all 9th-12th grade students must complete two job shadows before graduation, providing them with valuable real-world career related experiences.

Some reminders:

- The instructional day begins at 7:45. Students must be in their first-period class by this time or will be marked tardy. Students will be dismissed at 2:33.
- The Homecoming Ceremony and Football game will be on September 5th.
- Picture Day is September 10th.
- Open House is scheduled for September 17th, from 6:00 to 8:00 PM.
