We visited 17 partner high schools to promote our CTE programs to 10-11th grade students. Our recruiting efforts were validated by the large number of students who have already submitted applications. Lots of work lies ahead for planning for anticipated student growth and interest in our school. We are ready for the challenge!

CAVIT Makes Plans for Maricopa Site



CAVIT and the City of Maricopa partnered on a new satellite campus. The City gave approval for CAVIT to lease 5 acres in the city limits. Planning has begun for the new school with talks centering

around campus design, CTE programs to be offered, and partnership opportunities. A Phase One campus completion date has been set for July, 2028. Future high school 11-12th graders in Maricopa who want to take part in career training will have a much shorter commute as a result of the new campus.

Career Speaker Forum Project



First year students worked in groups to carry out CAVIT's Career Speaker Forum project. Created as a career pathways awareness activity, students invited industry professionals to come into their classrooms to speak about the workplace environment, industry trends, and ways to secure employment. A total of 83 folks spoke to classes and rated the event with a 100% satisfaction score when answering the survey prompt - Was giving your time to present a valuable experience?

Students Complete Work-Based Learning



CAVIT implements work-based learning activities for students to experience real-world application of the skills and content learned in the classroom. This learning boosts career confidence and helps to clarify career goals. It was commonplace to witness students work in teams to complete scenarios that replicate tasks found in the workplace.

Some examples of work-based learning was found in the following programs: Law students worked through traffic stop investigations and were evaluated on their process by county officers. Veterinary students held a vaccination clinic open to the community in partnership with Pinal County Animal Care and Control. Students were able to work alongside a veterinarian during the event.

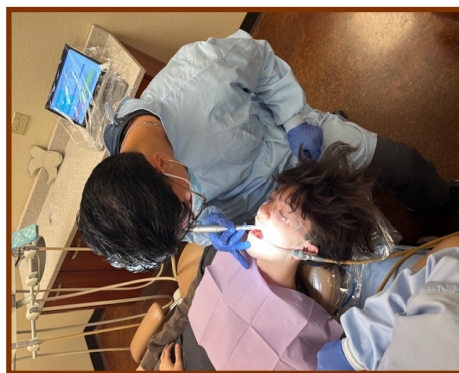


Clients Rate CAVIT Clinics with High Scores

Certification Testing Begins

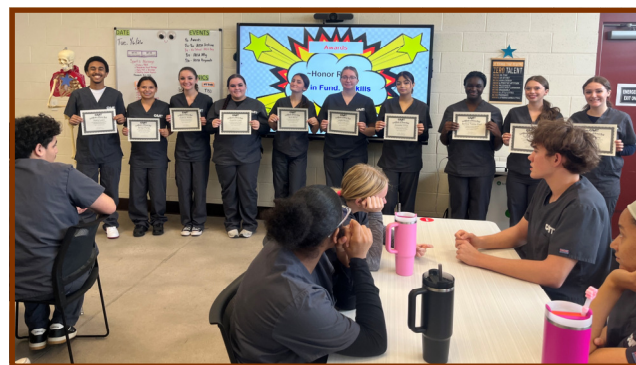
Last year saw 777 students earn an industry certification that help increase their marketability and increased opportunity for opening doors to better jobs. Staff saw students' confidence increase as testing results came in. The following certifications were earned by students to during first semester: OSHA - General and Cosmetology, Drone Part 107, NC3 Welding, Article 9, Basic Life Support, and Barbicide.



Additional certifications will be implemented in the spring semester. We are on track to meet or exceed the 777 number earned last year.
