CAVIT created the Quality Program system to measure standards of quality indicators found in highly performing instructional programs.



Increased Enrollment

CAVIT saw a surge in enrollment this year, adding more than 300 students and growing our numbers to 1,150. Our school received students from 17 high schools, online students, home school students, and ESA participants. The student enrollment growth can be attributed to CAVIT's programs that meet students' career goals.



Construction Projects

The Building 600 project is on track for completion for December, 2025. This project will provide classroom and lab space for Construction and Powersports Technology programs. Once second semester starts, ground will be broken on the Building 700 project that will provide enlarged space for our growing Medical Science program led by three teachers.



New Career Training Programming Offered

CAVIT was excited to offer six new career training programs to students for this school year. Students were offered programming in Nail Technology, Barbering, Powersports Technology, Cybersecurity, Esports, and Aviation Technology. These programs whelp students explore career options, connect with industry professionals and gain valuable industry certifications that employers seek in candidates. Additional teachers were hired to develop curriculum and classroom experiences to ensure students received quality instruction.
