


Anna and the Swallow Man by Gavriel Savit – 1160L; grades teemagers; Historical fiction


Kraków, 1939. A million marching soldiers and a thousand barking dogs. This is no place to grow up. Anna Łania is just seven years old when the Germans take her father, a linguistics professor, during their purge of intellectuals in Poland. She's alone. And then Anna meets the Swallow Man. He is a mystery, strange and tall, a skilled deceiver with more than a little magic up his sleeve. And when the soldiers in the streets look at him, they see what he wants them to see. The Swallow Man is not Anna's father--she knows that very well--but she also knows that, like her father, he's in danger of being taken, and like her father, he has a gift for languages: Polish, Russian, German, Yiddish, even Bird. When he summons a bright, beautiful swallow down to his hand to stop her from crying, Anna is entranced. She follows him into the wilderness. Over the course of their travels together, Anna and the Swallow Man will dodge bombs, tame soldiers, and even, despite their better judgment, make a friend. But in a world gone mad, everything can prove dangerous. Even the Swallow Man.



Audacity by Melanie Crowder - 1120L; grades 4-8; Historical fiction Audacity is inspired by the real-life story of Clara Lemlich, a spirited young woman who emigrated from Russia to New York at the turn of the twentieth century and fought tenaciously for equal rights. Bucking the norms of both her traditional Jewish family and societal conventions, Clara refuses to accept substandard working conditions in the factories on Manhattan's Lower East Side. For years, Clara devotes herself to the labor fight, speaking up for those who suffer in silence. In time, Clara convinces the women in the factories to strike, organize, and unionize, culminating in the famous Uprising of the 20,000.



Catch-22 by Joseph Heller — 1140L; grades 5-8; Historical fiction
At the heart of Catch-22 resides the incomparable, malingering bombardier,
Yossarian, a hero endlessly inventive in his schemes to save his skin from the
horrible chances of war. His efforts are perfectly understandable because as
he furiously scrambles, thousands of people he hasn't even met are trying to
kill him. His problem is Colonel Cathcart, who keeps raising the number of
missions the men must fly to complete their service. Yet if Yossarian makes
any attempts to excuse himself from the perilous missions that he is
committed to flying, he is trapped by the Great Loyalty Oath Crusade, the
hilariously sinister bureaucratic rule from which the book takes its title: a man
is considered insane if he willingly continues to fly dangerous combat
missions, but if he makes the necessary formal request to be relieved of such
missions, the very act of making the request proves that he is sane and
therefore ineligible to be relieved.



The Phantom Tollbooth by Norton Juster – 1000L; grades 3-8; Fantasy fiction For Milo, everything's a bore. When a tollbooth mysteriously appears in his room, he drives through only because he's got nothing better to do. But on the other side, things seem different. Milo visits the Island of Conclusions (you get there by jumping), learns about time from a ticking watchdog named Tock, and even embarks on a quest to rescue Rhyme and Reason. Somewhere along the way, Milo realizes something astonishing. Life is far from dull. In fact, it's exciting beyond his wildest dreams!
