It is the responsibility of the Consolidated Districts of Orange, Petersham, and R.C. Mahar to identify any child who may have a disability.

The Consolidated Districts are also responsible for the evaluation of those students to determine if they are eligible for special education or related services under Federal law IDEA (Individuals with Disabilities Education Act) or Massachusetts State Law, 603 CMR 28 (Massachusetts Special Education Regulation)
