B. Specific Items of District Business which require Action

a. PUBLIC HEARING:

- i. **Second review of the Yavapai County Curriculum *Promoting Health Among Teens! (Abstinence Only)* Laurel Abdelnour from the Yavapai County Health Department will be available for questions.** Focusing on knowledge, attitudes and skills that encourage and assist young people in implementing abstinence in their relationships. The curriculum presented will be available for review for

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60 days before final request for approval and is an updated version of what has previously been approved. Links to the curriculum with 30-day Sample Access have been on the district website since March 2, 2026. The request for final approval be on May 12, 2026.

- ii. **First review of Character Strong tier one classroom supports presented by Shelby Miller.** Character Strong strengthens Tier 1 culture by teaching life skills, building strong relationships, and creating consistent expectations across classrooms. Our Tier 1 curriculum includes built-in prevention supports—such as bullying prevention, substance use prevention, and child safety—so schools can support the whole child without adding multiple programs. Strong Tier 1 systems improve belonging, behavior, and readiness to learn academically. This program will be funded through the Title I Grant Budget. <https://Characterstrong.com>
- b. **Request to discuss and approve the following field trips which are more than 50 miles from the school district:**
 - i. 8th Grade Reward trip to Golfland/Sunsplash and Castles-N-Coasters on May 11, 2026. Students will pay \$60/each with any remaining cost being paid out of Student Activities Fundraiser profits. (estimated transportation cost \$493.89 To be paid from tax credit.)
- c. **Request to discuss and approve the agreement with ASBAIT for health insurance coverage for 2026-2027.** As discussed at last month's meeting ASBAIT came to the district with a quote that was less than the current year rates. The district is requesting approval of \$675/month per employee for district contribution to health insurance coverage resulting in a savings to the district and the employees.
- d. **Request to discuss and approve the Employee Staffing Agreement with Educational Services, LLC (1GPA Contract 22-09PV-03) for the 2026-2027 year.** There are no significant material changes to this agreement from our previous approved agreement. Changes are structural updates and updated information on expanded services.
