B. Specific Items of District Business which require Action

a. PUBLIC HEARING:

- i. **Second Public Hearing on the review of Character Strong tier one classroom supports presented by Shelby Miller.** Character Strong strengthens Tier 1 culture by teaching life skills, building strong relationships, and creating consistent expectations across classrooms. Our Tier 1 curriculum includes built-in prevention supports—such as bullying prevention, substance use prevention, and child safety—so schools can support the whole child without adding multiple programs. Strong Tier 1 systems improve belonging, behavior, and readiness to learn academically. The first public hearing was held on April 14, 2026 and final approval will be requested at the June 9, 2026 meeting. This program will be funded through the Title I Grant Budget. <https://Characterstrong.com>

ii. Public Hearing on the Final Revision of the FY 2025-2026 Budget.

- b. **Request for discussion and approval of the Final Revision of the FY 2025-2026 Budget.** The overview of estimated changes was presented by Business Manager, Ori Womack, at the April meeting. The final revision as presented must be Governing Board approved and submitted annually before May 15.

- c. **Request for discussion and approval of Catapult Summer School programing.** Catapult Learning offers a k-5 rigorous summer program which blends academics and enrichment designed to support student learning throughout the summer. The total cost of the Summer Programming is \$19,002.26 and will be paid out of Title I Grant Funds.
- d. **Request for discussion and approval of the Yavapai County Curriculum *Promoting Health Among Teens! (Abstinence Only)*.** Laurel Abdelnour from the Yavapai County Health Department has been available for questions since the first Public Hearing on March 10, 2026. Focusing on knowledge, attitudes and skills that encourage and assist young people in implementing abstinence in their relationships. The curriculum presented will be available for review for 60 days before final request for approval and is an updated version of what has previously been approved. Links to the curriculum with 30-day Sample Access have been on the district website since March 2, 2026.
- e. **Request for discussion and approval Discipline Matrix effective FY26-27.** Presented by Mrs. Wheeler and the Leadership team present. Beaver Creek is requesting to add an updated points system to our current discipline matrix. This would allow students and families to be aware of risk to long term suspension or expulsion.
- f. **Request for discussion and approval for an increase in tuition for our preschool program for students who are 3 and 4 years old.** Due to increasing costs and decrease in support funding (Quality First) the District is requesting a higher tuition cost to help create a self-sustaining program. As a reminder, preschool students are not state funded. In order to continue to provide a quality program with highly-qualified staff, Beaver Creek School is requesting to approve the hours and tuition updates, as presented.
- g. **Request for discussion and approval of the Annual Transportation IGA with Camp Verde Unified District to continue transporting high school students for the 2026-2027 school year.** This is an annual Intergovernmental Agreement with CVUSD. There are no changes and only dates have been updated.
- h. **Request for discussion and approval of the modification to the Retirement Incentive Program for 2026-2027.** The Governing Board approved this document on March 10, 2026. After review the district is requesting clarification and streamlining of the second year employment salary for any employee regardless of classification.
